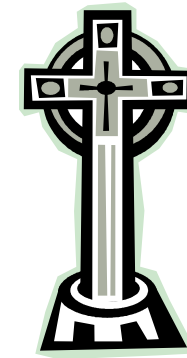

Christ Church Celebrates 140 Years

Wednesday, October 3rd, we celebrated our 140th anniversary as an Episcopal Church in Tyler. It was a grand event and a wonderful way to renew our commitment to the promises and vision held by those few people in previous generations. Again, I would like to invite each of you to imagine what it would have been like 140 years ago as a group of visionaries, as few as four lay people, along with Bishop Gregg, gathered together to dream of spreading the Gospel through the Episcopal Church. A small, but vital, seed was planted that has grown into the wonderful, spiritual tradition that we have inherited. I asked that night how many baptisms have been celebrated, how many prayers have been offered since our forebears came together as a worshipping community? Our church is layered over and enriched by these unceasing prayers and offerings to the God who called us into being.

The English word “focus” comes from the Latin word meaning “hearth.” What a wonderful image – an ancient family gathered around the fire, which offers warmth, light, and comfort in the midst of their home. We have thrived as a spiritual community of faith because we have at our center the love of Christ and the power of the cross to transform our lives. Additionally, one of the definitions of “focal point” is the point at which a lens will concentrate light such that it will ignite kindling. Our hearts burn with the love of Christ because he has focused his love, presence and power within us. By his power, we *are* a community of Episcopalians who have at our center the risen Christ and we *are* the very lens through which he focuses his power in the world.

Wednesday night was a wonderful celebration of our tradition, our spirit and the sacrifices, which have been made on our behalf. How could we ever repay or even begin to thank those who

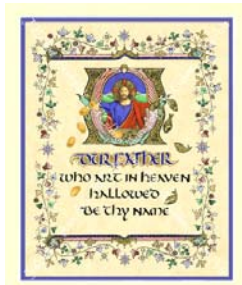

Youth Ministry

I never took time to read the newspaper until I enrolled in my "Writing for Mass Media" class at UT Tyler. My professor gives us weekly current events quizzes, and draws content from the Tyler paper. All we have to do to prepare is read the paper.

Now I realize how awful this world can seem, even in the Tyler area. The other day I read a story about a man in a nearby community who was taken into custody after beating his 9-month-old twins. The boy has brain damage, and the girl has internal bleeding. The paper said both are expected to recover.

But imagine growing up in a world where you one day discover that the reason your father is absent in your life is because he brutalized you as an infant. You will learn to believe that you were not wanted; that you were despised and cast aside.

Sometimes the simple task of preparing for class brings a gloomy light on my day. But then I remembered something that helped the light break through the sadness found in the paper. As I read that story, I remembered that I *AM* wanted. In fact, *I AM* wants me. And HE doesn't just want me...He *PURSUES* me.

That is an incredible comfort to me; to be pursued by such an awesome god, the God. He made the world and still He is longing, even pining to love me, hold me, and tell me everyday that I am wanted. I am loved and cherished. There is a song by Shane Barnard and Shane Everett that speaks of how God loves us, and refuses to despise us. It speaks from the perspective of God who pursues us like a man pursuing a woman's love. Listen as God affirms his unending love for, and pursuit of, us. It goes like this:

He will allure her, He will pursue her and call her out to wilderness with flowers in His hand. She is responding, beat up and hurting; deserving death but offerings of life are found instead.

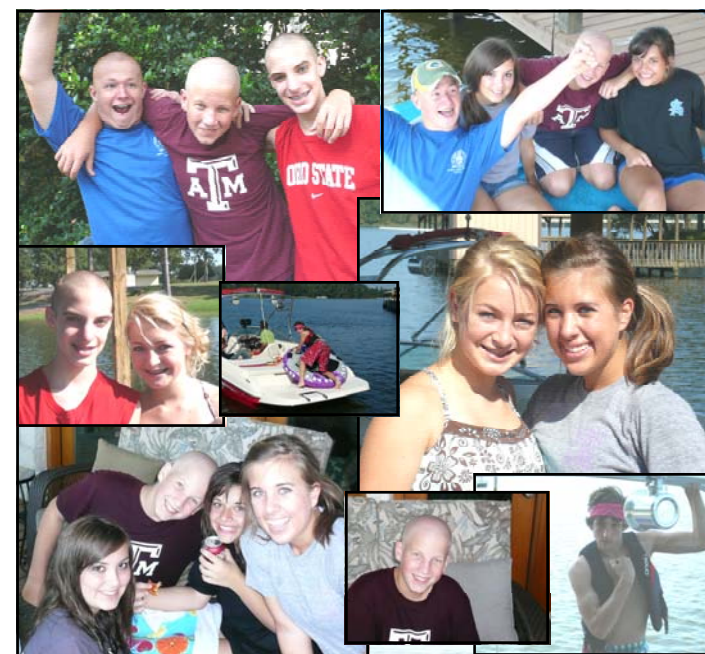
She will sing, she will sing; oh, to You.
She will sing as in the days of youth.
As You lead her away to valleys low;
to acres of hope, acres of hope

Here in the valley, walk close beside me;
don't look back for love is growing vineyards
