## From the Rector:

*The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of bishop, he desires a noble task. Therefore a bishop must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil. 1 Timothy 3.1-7*

*A bishop, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it. Titus 1.7-9*

From the first century, God has raised up bishops from the Christian community charged to lead the Church. The letters to Titus and Timothy describe some attributes expected of them, and a description of their responsibilities is offered in the Episcopal ordination service in the Book of Common Prayer.

God willing, delegates from every congregation in the Diocese of Texas will gather at a special electing convention at Christ Church Cathedral in Houston on June 2, 2012 to elect a new bishop to serve as an assisting or suffragan bishop with residence and an office in Tyler and a primary focus on congregations in East Texas.

After a bishop is elected in June, he will have to receive consents, or votes approving his election, from a majority of the bishops and elected lay and clergy leadership in the Episcopal Church.

Once the bishop-elect has received the required majority of consents to his election, the diocese of Texas will hold a service of Ordination of a Bishop. During that ordination service, the following charge will be directed at the bishop-elect:

*My brother, the people have chosen you and have affirmed their trust in you by acclaiming your election. A bishop in God's holy Church is called to be*

# Experiencing Epiphany



## The Path to Life (Becoming Like Jesus)

Aslan is on the prowl. In our life together here at Christ Church, God is up to something. He is beginning to do some amazing new things in and through us, and it is glorious to behold.

Of the many Kingdom developments fomenting in our community, though, none is more exciting than our Christ Church neighborhood groups, being kicked off even as I write.

In our approach to forming these groups, we have relied heavily upon the philosophy of ministry developed by our friends at Renovare, a ministry organization which helps churches and Christians grow more deeply into the life of Jesus Christ. (In fact, the book series we are using, the *Good and Beautiful* series by James Bryan Smith, is a Renovare publication.)

In his book *The Divine Conspiracy*, Dallas Willard casts a vision for what he calls “a curriculum for Christlikeness.” Two basic themes emerge here: when it comes to growing more into the likeness of Jesus, God provides us with a set of *narratives* and a set of *practices*. This curriculum for Christlikeness finds its fullest expression to date in these books by James Bryan Smith.

These narratives (the creation stories, the Abrahamic cycle, the exodus story, the story of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, the narrative of the establishment and

growth of the Church, etc.) give us something with which to combat the “stories” which “blow in the wind” of our culture. God does not call us (Nancy Reagan notwithstanding!) to “just say no.” Rather, he gives us something to *embrace*, something with which to *replace* the destructive narratives handed to us by our parents, the mass media, the “principalities and powers,” etc.

St. Paul urges us to be transformed by the renewing of our *minds* (Rom 12:1-2) which is exactly what these new narratives allow us to do. In them we soak our minds and hearts, allowing them to capture our imagination and kindle our hopes. We enter into them, not by ourselves, but with a community of fellow pilgrim believers. They become for us, particularly in the form of the Creed, true reality.

However, narratives alone would be insufficient, for we are not disembodied minds. Hence, the necessity of a new set of practices emphasized by Renovare. Practices such as resting one day a week, developing a habitual rule of prayer, gathering in community for intentional study and prayer.

Each chapter of the *Good and Beautiful God* (the first installment of the three-volume *Good and Beautiful* series) includes a section dealing with the new narratives of Christ as well as a section on the spiritual practices, the disciplines of the body, of the community of Christ followers. When you put these two dimensions of spirituality together, particularly in the context of community, you have a powerful, dynamic method for growing into the likeness of Jesus Christ.

This is what we are doing in our Christ Church neighborhood groups. Won't you join us?

*With your fellow bishops you will share in the leadership of the Church throughout the world. Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope.*

*Your joy will be to follow him who came, not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many. Book of Common Prayer 517*

For the next six months, I encourage every member of Christ Church to pray for the diocese and for all those who participate in the search process. I will be praying that we elect a bishop who reflects the attributes described in the epistles to Titus and Timothy, an apostolic leader who will “guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church.” I invite you to join me.

## **AUTOMATIC DRAFT OF PLEDGE PAYMENTS**

We at Christ Church currently have 24 parishioners taking advantage of the convenience of automatic draft to pay financial pledges to Christ Church. You may enroll, make changes or cancel at any time. This process is secure, easy and reliable. As always, your contributions will be reflected on your quarterly statements. Your pledge payment will be drafted from your checking account on the 5<sup>th</sup> and/or the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month and, if you desire, notification by e-mail will be sent to you at each transaction from our financial institution, Southside Bank.

Here's how it works: Decide how much is to be drafted and select a start date. Choose to pay once per month on the 5<sup>th</sup> or on the 20<sup>th</sup>, or twice per month on the 5<sup>th</sup> and the 20<sup>th</sup>. Complete and sign the ACH Form and attach a voided check, including e-mail address if you wish to be notified each month. Turn in your form to the Parish Administrator.

A confirmation letter will be sent to you on the day I receive and enter your form into the system.
