

Not only do we need and rely on one another. Not only are we family. We are one body.


We minister to others as a body. We worship as a body.

from the associate rector...

It is that time of the year. School has started (well sort of). The weather is cooler. Football season has started (sort of), and Covid-19 is still with us. Fall also is a time in the life of the Church when we turn our attention to stewardship. Covid-19 has changed many things, but not the need for us to focus on the finances needed for Christ Church to continue sharing the Gospel, training disciples, and serving the community in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. By now, you have probably received a letter from Stewardship Chairman, Bob Westbrook along with an excellent brochure that gives the theme and an overview of the Christ Church 2021 Stewardship Campaign. Many thanks to our talented Director of Communications, Samantha Hague, who went above and beyond to get these materials completed. Please give stewardship materials your prayerful attention.

When I think about stewardship, the name Hudson Taylor comes to mind. He was the founder of the China Inland Mission, and he believed that stewardship was not just about money, but was more importantly about faith and prayer. Taylor was born into a devout Methodist family in England in 1832, and his parents dedicated him to the Lord while he was yet in the womb. While still a child, Taylor decided that he wanted to be a missionary to China. He studied medicine and surgery in London, but trained for the missionary life in China during his studies by choosing to "live by faith." His living quarters were in a London slum, and he subsisted on brown bread and apples. He read everything he could find on China and studied the Chinese language.

Taylor's first mission to China was a disaster, and he suffered a health breakdown. During the six years that he was recuperating in England, Taylor became burdened for the eleven provinces of inland China that were without a single missionary. Taylor formed the China Inland Mission, and arrived in China in 1866 with a small group of inexperienced missionaries with no denomination behind them and no visible means of support. These raw recruits faced incredible hostility and opposition, but they persevered, mighty in faith and fervent in prayer. By the time that China fell to the communists in 1948, and China Inland Mission was forced to leave the country, they were the largest mission agency in China with 1,400 Western missionaries and a church membership of over 100,000. Today, it is estimated that there are over 100 million Christians in China in spite of the persecution by the Chinese government.

Hudson Taylor's influence went far beyond China. My connection is through the Bible Study Fellowship whose founder, A. Wetherell Johnson was a China Inland Mission missionary, and the Trinity School for Ministry whose financial plan is based on the China Inland Mission model. J. Herbert Kane, a former CIM missionary writes, "The secret of Hudson Taylor's life may be summed up in four simple propositions:

There is a living God. He has spoken his word. He means what He says.

And He is willing and able to perform what he has promised."

The cornerstone of Taylor's theology was a firm belief in the faithfulness of God. He said many times that God's work carried on in God's way would never lack God's supply. Remembering Hudson Taylor, let's approach this Stewardship Campaign 2021 in faith and prayer.



Body of Christ Stewardship 2021 in Action






