

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross. Hebrews 12.1-2

At the Sydney Olympics, the world was introduced to Eric "The Swimmer" Moussambani of Equatorial Guinea. The 22-year-old African had only learned to swim the previous January. He had only practiced in a 20-meter pool without lane markers, and he had never raced more than 50 meters. By special invitation of the International Olympic Committee, Eric had been entered in the 100-meter men's freestyle.


When the other two swimmers in his heat were disqualified because of false starts, Moussambani was forced to swim alone. Eric was, to use the words of an Associated Press story about his race, "charmingly inept." He never put his head under the water's surface and flailed wildly to stay afloat. With ten meters left to the wall, some spectators thought he might drown! Yet the capacity crowd at the Olympic Aquatic Center stood to their feet and cheered Eric on. After the African reached the wall, caught his breath and regained his composure, the swimmer said, "I want to send hugs and kisses to the crowd. It was their cheering that kept me going."


We have a cheering section. We cannot see them all, but the book of Hebrews reminds us that a 'great cloud of witnesses', composed of all the faithful departed, is pulling for us as we make our way through this trying season.

An Update on Tyler in Common

If memory (and the hard drive on my Macbook) serve, I last wrote about our work together in Tyler in Common in June of this year, nine months after our initial "big event" on the fourth floor of Christ Church: a viewing and discussion of the documentary film "Traces of the Trade" dealing with the American slave trade of the nineteenth century.

The impetus for that June update was the contentious set of events which took place last summer involving the shooting of several African Americans by white police officers. Also that month I participated in a "rally" on the downtown Tyler square to commemorate—I believe for the first time ever—the dozens of lynchings of African Americans which took place in Tyler over the previous decades. It was a sobering honor to speak at that event, representing Christ Church and the Episcopal Church.

I come to you again with yet another update on Tyler in Common, this little group of folks (most but not all of whom are Episcopalians) who are prayerfully beginning to come together to advocate for wise justice in our community.

What does "wise justice" mean? Well, we are in the process of figuring that out ... and yet here is an idea or a "seed" which might help provoke the imagination. Consider the public bus system in Tyler. Now, I have never ridden the bus in Tyler (although I frequently did in Austin and prior to that in Washington, D.C. and Philadelphia). But I am confident in my assertion that it is not adequate. I have listened to "experts" speak about this; I have read reports and studies on it. How should we think about that? Would an improved bus system—one that is actually reliable as a means of regular transportation—be a wise and loving goal for Christians in this city to have? What would it take to improve the bus system in a meaningful way?

The bus system is only one example among many, including the "food desert" that exists in North Tyler, housing practices in North Tyler, or mental health services for the indigent (to name just a few).

I am not saying that any of these issues are "black and white," or that solutions will be easy.

However, I am convinced that a) there are real systemic patterns of injustice in our city; b) that Christ calls us to bring healing into such situations; and c) that a fail-proof way to begin that process is by listening deeply to folks who have experienced first hand various forms of suffering in this regard that I have not.

Finally, I wanted to share with you the new vision statement, mission statement, and core values which Tyler in Common has recently adopted (thanks to Mr. Jeff Williams of Tyler Together, the Rev. Brian Lightner of St. James C.M.E. Church, Dr. Paul Wick, and Mr. Stephen Fierbaugh for this tireless efforts):

Tyler In Common Vision

Tyler In Common envisions a beloved community where neighbors work together in harmony, with dignity to transform relationships for an equitable, abundant life.

Tyler In Common Mission

Tyler In Common is committed to responding to racial injustice by growing a beloved community of justice seekers and reconcilers through: acknowledging barriers, seeking equity, and providing needed resources.





Stewardship Campaign 2021




