

From the Rector:

Perhaps you have heard of re-entry anxiety?

Even as the public health situation in Smith County has improved dramatically, after fifteen months of pandemic, many Texans, and many millions of people all over the country, are facing re-entry anxiety as they increasingly socialize with other people again.

Jesus calls us to a life together—living with other people in Christian community. Acts 2.42 reminds us that from the beginning of the Church, believers "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." We worship together, pray together, serve together, celebrate together, and mourn together.

The social, spiritual, and psychological consequences of the trial we have endured have made a deep mark on many people. Some cannot wait to shake and hug people by the dozens. Other are much more cautious about interaction with other people, regardless of vaccination. We are all in this together.

Over the coming weeks, as we increasingly interact with others – in church and beyond, out of love, Christ Church will continue to disinfect gathering spaces before and after their use. We will continue to keep some distance between families in worship services. And we will wait until the 'all clear' to restore the common cup at Eucharistic services. Christ Church remains a safe, welcoming, vital place for worship and fellowship.

John 13.34-35 records an essential teaching of Christ: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Spring has come to Tyler. Masks are no longer required attire.

It's time again for Vacation Bible School. Time for fellowship. Time for laughter. Time for worship. It's time again to experience the love of Christ together at Christ Church. See you Sunday!

Third Sunday for the Poor – Almsgiving Sundays:

Sunday, March 15, 2020 was the beginning of the "Great Covid-19 Exile" at Christ Church, Tyler. On that Sunday, we did not worship in the church, and services were conducted virtually from both Christ Church Downtown and Christ Church South. After a few weeks, the churches were open again for worship, but on a very limited basis. Social distancing kept the church attendance minimal, and to inhibit the spread of the virus, the collection plate (alms basin) was not passed during the service. The result of this has been that for the past 15 months, some of us have forgotten, but many may not even have been aware of, an old Christ Church tradition – almsgiving Sunday, The Third Sunday for the Poor.

For many years at Christ Church on the third Sunday of each month, the "plate offering," the cash or checks with the notation "almsgiving" or "Third Sunday for the Poor" dropped into the collection plate has been designated as money that goes to the needy. The Westminster Dictionary of Theological Terms defines almsgiving as coming from the Greek word eleëmosynē, meaning "charity," "mercy." The act of giving to those in need is an expression of Christian love. The almsgiving on the third Sunday is to help the needy in our community and is in addition to normal giving. This almsgiving was commanded by Jesus. From Luke 18: 18 A certain ruler asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" 19 Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. 20 You know the commandments: You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; Honor your father and mother." 21 He replied, "I have kept all these since my youth." 22 When Jesus heard this, he said to him, "There is still one thing lacking. Sell all that you own and distribute the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

Almsgiving was also practiced by the early church. From Acts 9:36 Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. Saint Paul said in Acts 24:17 Now after some years I came to bring alms to my nation and to offer sacrifices.

As we reopen Christ Church to normal worship, it is time to renew the tradition of almsgiving on the third Sunday of the month. Thank you to those of you who have continued to send in checks for the needy throughout the pandemic. As a community of faith, we want to be able to help those in need. *Come, you that are blessed by my Father,*

inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.


