

On Sunday mornings, the nurseries are open on both campuses during the 9:00 and 11:00 services for children 4 and under.



an interview with the Reverend *Doctor* Matthew R. Boulter

Fr. David shared in the September 3rd e-blast:

A great story of perseverance and accomplishment comes from our own Fr. Matt Boulter.


Over seven years ago, while continuing his full-time work at Christ Church, Matt began his advanced studies in philosophy and theology at the University of Dallas. There have been many challenging turns on the road to a PhD, but after years of hard work and tremendous effort, Fr. Matt is now officially the Reverend Dr. Matthew Boulter!


The pandemic created one final challenge, but the Rev. Dr. Boulter persevered, and has been awarded a Doctorate of Philosophy from the National University of Ireland in Maynooth, County Kildare, Ireland. His doctorate is a great testament to a brilliant mind, a supportive family, hard work, and exceptional perseverance.

Congratulations, Reverend Dr. Matt!

What did you study for your PhD?

My PhD is in philosophy, which I have had a deep desire for ever since 1994, when an Anglo-Catholic philosophy professor at UT Austin named Louis Mackey planted something deep in my soul. The class was on Kierkegaard & Derrida, and by the end of it I knew that I needed to study philosophy and theology.





When I moved to Tyler in 2010, I went to a friend's birthday party in Dallas, and met a German man who was a brilliant philosopher (who also wrote about theological topics). His name is Philipp Rosemann. He emailed me and invited me to visit with him, which I did. Then he started putting books in my hand and saying, "Why don't you read this book. Let's get together in a month and discuss it."

On thing led to another and I applied to the philosophy PhD program at the University of Dallas, and was fully funded for my entire time there.

What University?

After five years of coursework at the University of Dallas (driving to Dallas twice a week on average) and passing comprehensive exams (the most rigorous experience I've ever had), Dr. Rosemann called me and said that he was leaving UD to become the department chairperson at the National Univ of Ireland (Maynooth campus). He also invited me to "go with him," finishing my dissertation under his guidance.

So, in late October of 2019 (after about a year and a half of focused work, including a stay at the Pope Benedict XVI Institute in Regensburg, Germany doing research) I submitted the dissertation to the University.

I successfully defended it in June (on zoom) in front of John Milbank (an Anglican theologian from England) and William Desmond (an Irish Catholic philosopher who lives and works in Belgium). These two men are two of my absolute heroes intellectually and it was an unbelievably humbling experience to defend and discuss my work with them.

How long did it take?

The entire PhD (coursework, comprehensive exams, the dissertation) took about 7.5 years to complete.

Why the topic?

My dissertation is entitled "Repetition and Mythos: Ratzinger's Bonaventure and the Meaning of History." It deals with the "second dissertation" (it's a German thing!) of Joseph Ratzinger on the last set of lectures given by St. Bonaventure which are in some sense a "commentary" of the days of creation of Genesis 1. Yet this "sermon series"—called the "Collationes in Hexaemeron—is much more than just that: it is really a "theology of history" which deeply redefined how Christians in the West thought about history and eschatology (since previously Augustine had had that "last word" on all that).

I chose this topic for two reasons: one practical and one deeply "existential." Practically, Dr. Rosemann proposed it to me, knowing that it kind of a "sexy" or interesting (and under-studied) topic and that it might fill a gap in the current scholarship and also open doors for me.

Secondly, I am deeply interested in eschatology and how we ought to think about the end of the world (something we cannot do in isolation from the beginning and middle of the world). Broadly speaking, the question of the relationship of history to ontology, is a huge issue for me.

Anything else you want to say?

Just over the last few weeks (after defending the dissertation) I have—somewhat surprisingly—been having lots of success getting my work published. I have three pieces forthcoming: one on Dante, one on Aquinas' notion of anger, and one (co-authored with Philipp Rosemann) on the same topic (basically) as my dissertation.

I expect that my (revised) dissertation will be published as a book in early 2021.

The opportunity to do this PhD is one of the most deeply satisfying gifts I've ever received, experiences I've ever had. The huge sacrifices have been totally "worth it." I'm thankful to so many people for allowing it to happen!

Interesting facts:

The 1.5 line-spaced document is 240 pages, including a 10 page bibliography, and is 108758 words.






