

# from the associate rector...

#### PRE-MARITAL COUNSELING IN A RAPIDLY CHANGING WORLD

If I were to make a list of the greatest joys and privileges of pastoral ministry as a priest in the church, near the top of that list would be weddings. I love to come alongside couples—old and young, Episcopalian and not—and journey with them toward the big day. I'm encouraged that, by my best estimate, I have still performed more weddings as a minister in the church than funerals!

And yet, over the two decades that I've been performing weddings (including all the necessary counseling) the culture in which we find ourselves has shifted drastically.

I'm talking about the dominant assumptions, especially among folks under age 40, pertaining to human sexuality and gender. As recently as fifteen years ago I could safely assume that discussing the sacrament of marriage as pertaining to a man and a woman would be uncontroversial. But that is no longer the case.

You see, the material I've used more over two decades of pastoral, pre-marital counseling is the teaching of the Reverend Timothy Keller, a Presbyterian minister in New York City who planted and developed Redeemer Presbyterian Church, a vibrant Gospel witness in that city, together with scores—perhaps hundreds—of derivative church plants dotting the globe.

Keller's 2013 New York Times bestseller, The Meaning of Marriage, is based in a previous set of sermons he originally preached in the mid-1990's, and it is those sermons I use in my counseling for potential couples. If I were to summarize this material, it would be this: marriage is a mysterious picture, or image, of the sacrificial love that exists between Christ and the Church. This is the core message, and its implications and applications to marriage or many and profound.

And yet, in our day and age, this claim is controversial, again, especially to young people. "Between a man and a woman?!" To their ears it sounds so bigoted, so non-inclusive, so oppressive.

As I write this article, I am sitting in the Portland, Oregon airport, having landed literally ten minutes ago. I'm here to perform my third wedding in five weeks. Of the three couples, two are folks who are 40-ish years old or younger.

Before beginning my counseling with these two couples, I made a special YouTube video, viewable only by them and addressed and tailored exclusively to them. In it I introduced myself, assured them of my prayers, and gave them a bit of orientation for the counseling regimen. But then, I acknowledged the elephant in the room. I gently and forthrightly put my cards on the table.

"In our counseling sessions, over the coming weeks," I told them, "I'll be working off the assumption that the sacrament of marriage holds between a man and a woman, since not only is this Tim Keller's view, but it is also, actually, essential to the point of the counseling sessions."

"Do I require that you agree with me on these issues in order for me to perform your wedding? Do I require that you 'sign on the dotted line' in that way? By no means. But I do want you to know where I'm coming from, and I don't want you to be shocked when you eventually realize that traditional nature of the marriage that's being presented here. I hope you end up agreeing with me on this, but even if you don't I want you to know that you are loved, and that it is a great honor and joy for me to be involved in your lives in this way."

Sure enough, in both cases, this preemptive video turned out to be a prudent move on my part, for later on in our discussions, sure enough the couples—one of them in particular—began to feel a bit of discomfort around the traditional character of marriage being presented. But I was able to hearken back to that introductory video I made for them, and to remind them about all this. After this they completely understood, and we moved on. Thankfully, they sensed my love.

Doing ministry in this contemporary world—and doing pre-marital counseling in particular—is complicated.

And yet, it is needed, and thus it is a joy...maybe more now than ever!

As Christ Church members, my family has been, and continues to be, blessed beyond measure by God's favor. Through the worship celebrations of the liturgical calendar, the celebration of holy matrimony, holy baptism, and in the seasons of profound sorrow in the loss of cherished family members, the love of our clergy and members of our Christ Church family have served to faithfully represent the body of Christ in each season. Seventeen years ago, Sunday, 10/03/2004, Fr. Harrison McLeod baptized our beautiful precious granddaughter in the nave. As part of our prayerful reflection of our stewardship commitment, it seems especially fitting to consider two of the baptismal responses we vow as part of our renewed commitment:

Today, I am reminded in a most tangible way that our family's journey continues to be led by the spirit and is blessed beyond measure through God's favor.

Also, that Sunday serves as an historical anniversary for our parish. In 1916, Rev. Snowden began seeking financial support to construct a new church building, during the great war and the Spanish Flu pandemic. Despite the challenges they experienced, our church forefathers and mothers heeded God's call and on October 6, 1918, the first sermon was preached in the new nave in downtown Tyler. They chose to proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ and to seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving their neighbors as themselves.






