From the Rector:

For many centuries, every year, forty-seven days before Easter Sunday, all over the world, Christians have gathered together the day before Ash Wednesday for a party.

Not just any party.

In Anglo-Saxon England, believers would enjoy a Shrove Tuesday pancake supper. Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients.

A traditional English pancake is very thin and is served immediately. Golden syrup or lemon juice and caster sugar have been the usual toppings for English pancakes.

According to writer Ellen Castelow, to this day in the UK, pancake races form an important part of the Shrove Tuesday celebrations – an opportunity for large numbers of people, often in fancy dress, to race down streets tossing pancakes. The object of the race is to get to the finishing line first, carrying a frying pan with a cooked pancake in it and flipping the pancake as you run.

The most famous pancake race takes place at Olney in Buckinghamshire. According to tradition, in 1445 a woman of Olney heard the shriving bell while she was making pancakes and ran to the church in her apron, still clutching her frying pan. The Olney pancake race is now world famous. Competitors have to be local housewives and they must wear an apron and a hat or scarf.

As an Episcopal Church within an hour and a half of the Louisiana state line, at Christ Church we generally follow a different Shrove Tuesday tradition – Mardi Gras. Rather than pancakes, most years we enjoy exceptional southern Louisiana cuisine, accompanied by party beads and – this year – a New Orleans Jazz Band!

It's been quite a season. We are ready for a great Mardi Gras party! Join the fun at Christ Church on Tuesday, March 1. We are due.

Keeping a Holy Lent

Here is one of the Proper Prefaces for Lent: You bid your faithful people cleanse their hearts, and prepare with joy for the Paschal feast; that, fervent in prayer and in works of mercy, and renewed by your Word and Sacraments, they may come to the fullness of grace which you have prepared for those who love you.

I think that this preface that is sometimes said during the Eucharistic Prayer in Lent provides a very good summary of a holy Lent. Lent is about cleansing, preparing, praying, giving, renewing, and growing. The ultimate purpose of Lent is to strengthen our spiritual lives, and in the early Church, it was a time when converts to Christ were taught the faith in preparation for their baptism at the Easter Vigil. Lent prepares us for Easter and our encounter with the risen Lord. It is a time of self-examination and repentance through prayer, fasting, self-denial, alms-giving, meditating on the Scriptures, and participating in the Sacraments. The key, however to keeping a holy Lent is time, time spent with God. Of course keeping a holy Lent assumes regular church attendance.

Here are several suggestions for personal Lenten activities:

- 1. Give yourself a spiritual checkup. Step back and reflect on how you are living your life and see if there are areas where there is a need for change or in religious language, repentance. I know that Confession is not widely practiced at Christ Church, but it can be good for the soul. It is completely confidential, and remember that you are confessing to God, not to a priest. Let us know if you want to schedule an appointment.
- 2. Dedicate at least 30 minutes in the morning and 30 minutes in the evening for prayer and reading the Bible. The Daily Office is a great way to do this. This year you can incorporate the readings from the Bible in One Year program.
- 3. Take advantage of the Lenten Teaching Series held at Christ Church every Tuesday at noon during Lent. This is a good time for prayer, reflection, and fellowship that includes a free lunch.
- 4. Find a good Christian book and read it during Lent. Some authors I recommend are C.S. Lewis, Dallas Willard, Alister McGrath, Bishop Tom Wright, and Henri Nouwen. A classic that is perfect for Lent is The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis.
- 5. Give alms. Find some clear need in our church or Tyler and donate.
- 6. You are probably not going to like this last suggestion. Self-denial. Giving something up for Lent like a food or a drink or an activity can help us focus. At a minimum, I recommend fasting at least for some period of time on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Lent is an opportunity for true spiritual growth not only for us individually, but for our Church. During Lent we can lay a spiritual foundation that will carry us through the entire year. Have a holy Lent!


