All of us have experienced disruption to our lives since March 2020.

One change we have endured involves Holy Eucharist at worship services. For the past two years, Christ Church, and all congregations in the diocese, has been prohibited by the Diocese of Texas from offering the sacramental wine at Holy Communion.

Yesterday, Bishop Doyle informed me that we can resume offering communion wine at eucharistic services at Christ Church. Therefore, **beginning this Sunday—March 13—**all baptized Christians are invited to receive the Sacrament of bread and wine, the body and the blood of Christ, at all eucharistic services at Christ Church.

Moreover, everyone is invited to receive Holy Eucharist or a blessing at the rail around the Lord's table. You are invited to stand or kneel at the rail to receive communion. You can receive the bread only, or you can intinct the communion bread in the communion wine, or you can eat the eucharistic bread and drink the sacramental wine. All are considered a sacramental 'full communion' with Christ Jesus our Lord.

While we continue to live with COVID 19, the public health landscape has dramatically improved. I invite you to join us for Holy Eucharist at Christ Church this Sunday morning.

To Fast, or not to Fast...

In June of 1965, Angus Barbieri of Tayport, Scotland, who weighed 456 pounds began a fast. His fast ended after 382 days in July of 1966, and Angus weighed in at 180 pounds. Barbieri retains the record for the longest fast without solid food, according to *Guinness Book of Records* officials. Wisely *Guinness*, however, no longer officially endorses records relating to fasting for fear of encouraging unsafe behavior. Our *Book of Common Prayer* lists only two days of fasting, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, well short of 382 days. Jesus fasted for 40 days as he was tempted by Satan in the wilderness. My point here is that asking us to fast on two Holy Days is not very much. It is obviously too late to fast on Ash Wednesday, but please consider fasting on Good Friday and maybe even some of the other days of Lent.

Why fast? The simple answer is that we should fast because Jesus fasted and in Matthew Chapter 6 it sounds as if he assumed that fasting is part of the Christian life. [Jesus said] And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. 17 But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, 18 that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. Notice, Jesus did not say if you fast; he said when you fast.

On Ash Wednesday, the service spoke of "the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith." One of the elements mentioned in the observance of a holy Lent is fasting. "The Bible describes fasting as a natural way for God's people as individuals or as a body to express humility, sorrow, repentance, seriousness in prayer, and a desire for God's manifest presence.



I once heard a story about a father who was trying to encourage his 10-year-old son to give up something for Lent. The father told the son, "You might want to consider giving up candy. Your mother and I have given up liquor for Lent." The little boy said, "But you and mom had wine last night." The father responded, "Your mother and I gave up hard liquor." The little boy said, "OK, I'll give up hard candy." Jesus said that the fasting is meaningless if it is hypocritical and not done in the right spirit.


In my opinion the purpose of Lent is to draw nearer to God. Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York says that Lent is like spring training in baseball. We are training for Good Friday and Easter Sunday, those great high holidays of the Church. Lent is a penitential period of 40 days where we examine our lives, but it can also be a time of great joy if we spend time in God's presence. Fasting and prayer is a great way to do this. Try starting slowly. A fast as short as 12 hours can be spiritually rewarding, and 24 hours is even better. You can't go wrong with a Lenten plan that includes prayer and fasting. Lent should be a time of serious introspection as we prepare for that great celebration of the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. I wish you a Holy Lent. Amen.

Please join us for the study of this most popular Psalm that points us to Jesus as the Good Shepherd.


A light lunch will follow the service in the Parish Hall.




Praying the rosary will be available in the chapel at 11:30am, before each Tuesday




