#### From the Rector:

When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land...At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice,

which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

was torn in two, from top to bottom. Mark 15.33-37

Holy Week is the most important week of the year.

It begins this Sunday, April 10—a week before Easter. Called Palm Sunday because we remember the grand entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. On Palm Sunday we hear a powerful telling of the arrest, abuse, and crucifixion of Jesus. Holy Week begins with a celebration which turns tragically to the Cross.

Throughout Holy Week, the Church will gather to pray and celebrate Holy Eucharist in the nave at noon on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday.

On Maundy Thursday in the evening, we will worship in the nave, recalling the Last Supper and—for the first time in two years—honor the example of Jesus, who washed of the apostles' feet in the Upper Room.

The following day—Good Friday—as Christ Church has for over a century, we will gather at noon to remember the Crucifixion and death of Christ Jesus on the Cross.

On Saturday morning, scores of children will scour the land at Christ Church South in search of Easter eggs!

Then late on Saturday evening, we will begin our celebration of the Resurrection, worshiping at the Great Vigil, and at six Easter services across Christ Church downtown and Christ Church South on Easter Sunday weekend.

Holy Week is a powerful succession of days and worship services in which we recall the grace of Christ Jesus our Lord. After a trying two years—in Tyler and across the world—come and experience a powerful Holy Week at Christ Church!

### from the associate rector...

#### Holy, Holy, Holy Week

As we come to the end of Lent, this Sunday, April 10 is commonly called Palm Sunday, but the official title for this service is The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday. These two traditional names reveal the dual focus of this service: Jesus' suffering and death on the Friday of Passover, and his triumphal entry into Jerusalem only a few days before. The Palm Sunday service begins with a procession with palms, and, this year, a reading from the Gospel of Luke:

As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" We sing All glory, laud, and honor to thee Redeemer King! To whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring.

Next in the service the mood dramatically changes with a reading from Isaiah 53:

He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity; and as one from whom others hide their faces he was despised, and we held him of no account. Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

After one of the most beautiful Christological statements in the Bible from the Letter to the Philippians, we then turn to the Passion Gospel. We go from the joyful celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem to his trial and torture by the Romans and horrible death on the Cross. In the early church the triumphal entry and passion narrative were two separate services, and, if the Presiding Bishop were ever to ask me to revise our liturgy (which I think you would agree is highly unlikely), I would have separate services for the triumphal entry and passion. Of course, we do have a service where the passion gospel is read on Good Friday, but in our secular society where many people need to work or go to school and can't be in church on Good Friday. Maybe that is why we have the passion gospel on the Sunday before Easter.

If you plan on attending church services on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, good for you. Wonderful. But by attending only the Sunday services you are missing something—most of Holy Week. The days between the two Sundays is a time to remember Christ's last week on the earth culminating in his sacrifice on the Cross for us. Holy Week is a time to prepare ourselves to celebrate Christ's defeat of death on Easter Sunday. At Christ Church we have Holy Eucharist at noon on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week. On Thursday at 7:00PM we remember the meal at which Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist on the night before he died, and for the washing of the disciples' feet. On Good Friday at noon swe remember Jesus' suffering and death while celebrating the victory over sin and death that he has won for us. Afterward, we have the opportunity to follow the Stations of the Cross. Please consider making Holy Week truly holy this year by being in church on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday but also by attending the weekday services at Christ Church. I look forward to seeing you there.


