music at Christ Church Jeffrey Ford / Choirmaster & Organist



Hello! My name is Sophie Breen, and I am a current Staff Singer here at Christ Church. I began my journey with the church through the Choir School of East Texas, and ever since then, I have pursued vocal music as my passion. I am currently studying Voice at Tyler Junior College and plan to receive my bachelor's degree in Vocal Performance. For two weeks of my summer, I had the honor of attending New York University's Classical Voice Intensive. I was one of approximately 30 students chosen from the applicant pool, and my attendance was made possible through a generous patron of the Choir School.

My first day began with everyone getting on stage and singing, followed by a masterclass. The intensive was amazingly fast paced, but I was eager to learn! Our days began with group yoga, then we branched off into three groups for classes. These consisted of lyric diction and song analysis. We ended the day with a full masterclass, each one having a different topic like "The Human Singing Voice." In addition to group classes, I also got two private voice lessons and coaching sessions. My private lessons with my professor Rosa Vento were incredible. I was able to learn so much in a brief period, and I now have even more tools at my disposal to improve! The same goes for my coaching sessions with my collaborative pianist, Ji Young Lee. She really encouraged me to work through my nerves and immerse myself in the story I was attempting to portray through my singing.

The final performance came far too soon, but I am confident that it was the best <u>performance</u> I have ever given (performance link: https://youtu.be/be_AjQYkFXY at 24:21). My time at NYU, though short, gave me so much confidence and reassurance that I needed. Of course, I could not visit the Big Apple without having a little fun! I saw my first two Broadway shows, *Moulin Rouge* and *The Phantom of the Opera*, and made so many friends! I am so incredibly grateful for this opportunity, and I cannot wait to return to New York!



Who of you have delighted in the satisfaction of eating a big Jucy's burger, or escaping to a world found in a beloved fiction, or playing a game with life-long friends, or finally perfecting the notes to a melody that stirs your soul? A source of similar delight has been found in reading/listening through Luke, Acts, Romans, and 1 Corinthians. Learning more deeply the salvation of God - that was first revealed through the Old Testament stories and prophets and has been fully revealed in the person and work of Jesus Christ - gives me feelings of BIG awe and BIG gratitude.

I have a question...Why delight in stories thousands of years old, especially with our culture's ridicule of ancient writings about a holy and loving Creator and our need of a Savior? A BIG stumbling block to delighting in the Bible is our culture placing evidential demands on its storytellers that ancient oral tradition and ancient authors never had in mind to provide or prove - think ancient stories from The Torah: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy. In these ancient storytellers' time there is no precedent to provide Enlightenment Era proofs for history and science in the ways our culture now demands. These storytellers were brilliant in their time and told the story of God to the best of their ability. Our culture's ridicule of the Bible is like dismissing George Washington Carver to have ever known the peanut plant because his writings never contained its complete genome. Can we all agree Mr. Carver really knew the peanut plant? Can we also agree that since his time greater revelation of the peanut plant has been discovered? This does not invalidate Mr. Carver's work; it fulfills the work he started. Similarly, Paul writes about God's greater revelation of Himself in His Son Jesus Christ (Romans 1:1-6). Paul does not invalidate Old Testament storytellers; he claims Jesus is the fulfillment of all their ancient stories!

While ancient storytelling is a stumbling block to our culture, don't let its ridicule invalidate the BIG claims the New Testament authors are making. Luke and his numerous eye-witnesses, Paul and his many church letters, claim Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of God's plan of salvation for our selfish, fearful, and unloving selves. They claim the Holy Spirit is the pouring out of God's power to "be" and "do":


- To be witnesses of Jesus Christ's salvation through repentance and baptism and telling the story of hope found in Jesus Christ to others
- To *do* by imitating Jesus Christ through union with Him in choosing to give mercy and love sacrificially


For me, the delight of the Bible - God's big story of restoring and repairing our relationship to Him and others - come from believing these BIG claims.








Genesis Bible Study with the Rector


