

Renew and deepen your commitment to following the bright light of Christ through the valleys and mountains of the coming year.



In the early morning, as the mist is rising off our backyard, I can look out the window to see a herd of puppies. That's right: Puppies. There are seven of them.

They are small enough to creep under the fence boards that divide our yards and seem to make it a habit to do so every morning. Each morning after eating their Rice Crispies, our boys (who have a lot in common with dogs) flock to play with these puppies.

I have to admit I love snuggling these furry little guys too. This is especially true since I am not responsible for feeding them and keeping them alive. And it is wonderful to be the recipient of love from these little creatures. I did nothing to deserve it, but they seem to find me endlessly interesting, nuzzling into my legs as I scratch their necks. I am not too sentimental when it comes to animals, but I have been enjoying these little dogs. And I can see the appeal of having one as a pet – they just love unconditionally, as far as puppies can love anyways.



Though God is not a puppy (and perhaps should not be compared to one), and though he is both our lover and our judge, he gives us his love freely. 
The beautiful service of Choral Evensong returns.






