We are at a stage in our family in which we are housebound most evenings. Four young kids and with early bedtimes mean we don't get out too much.

It also means we always have laundry to fold.

Lately, we've been folding parked in front the television. We've been on a spy kick, rewatching the older *Bourne* movies and more recently, the newer *The Night Agent* series. Both are lots of fun, filled with labyrinthine plots, tense music, and just enough romance and punchy-punchy to keep both of us interested.

In both *The Night Agent* and the *Bourne* films, there is a recurring motif. Both feature attempts to uncover the truth of the past, whether it is one's own (*Bourne*) or one's family's (*The Night Agent*). In each case the protagonist gets to the bottom of what has happened in years past by revisiting the people and places who were significant all these years ago. The truths that Peter Sutherland (played by Gabriel Basso) and David Webb aka Jason Bourne (played by Matt Damon) discover shed light on their whole lives. Remembering the past doesn't just correct wrong beliefs about what happened 'back then' but transforms their present and future as well.

As we continue in the season of Easter, this is what our Sunday readings and meditations are all about. How did Jesus's resurrection reframe the present, and what did it mean for the future?

I love the passage from Luke 24:13-47, where Jesus is walking with a couple of disciples along to Emmaus. They are perturbed because Jesus has died. They are conflicted about reports of the resurrection. And though Jesus is walking beside them in his resurrected body, they don't recognize him. They just pour out their hearts to this stranger on the road.


Jesus's response is a little bit of scolding. He tells them, 'Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into glory?'

What happens next is even better: Jesus goes through

the Scripture – our Old Testament – with them. He begins with Moses and the prophets and shows them that the Scriptures are all about him. All of the Bible points to Jesus. The lightbulb doesn't really come on for them until he breaks bread and gives it to them (but that is another story).

What Jesus is teaching his disciples here is a way to revisit Scripture – to look back at the past – but to see it all in a new light. Just like some key information about Peter Sutherland or Jason Bourne is enough to change the narrative of their lives, so Jesus is giving his disciples the keys they need to make sense of a jumble of Scripture and experience that until this point they had not been able to add up.

One of the best things we can do as Christians is to memorize passages of Scripture. It's good too to look back at the ways God has been at work with his people and in our lives as individuals. But if we've grown up as Christians or around Christians, we can be lulled into thinking we know the whole story about God in Christ because we get the drift of a handful of Bible stories. Eastertide might be a time for us to revisit all that we think we know. Perhaps we've got all of the facts straight, but we don't see how they fit together. It's only by looking at them again and again through what Jesus has done that varied passages of the Bible become a united story. It's only through Jesus that our fragmented lives can be come integrated. He is teaching us still by his Holy Spirit, we have only to listen.


