From the Rector:

Psalm 63.1-4:
O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you;
my soul thirsts for you;
my flesh faints for you,
as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory.

Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you.

So I will bless you as long as I live; in your name I will lift up my hands.

Human beings have been moved to worship God for thousands of years. Before the Israelites were firmly established as the people of God, Genesis 14 describes Melchizedek as the 'priest of God most high.' Many centuries before the Bible was written, people gathered to worship the one true God.

As we continue to endure triple digit days, it is hard to believe that autumn is coming. But September is a week away.

With the approach of the fall, a new season is upon us - a time to renew, to refresh, and to deepen our faith. Christ Church offers powerful worship services every Sunday on two campuses. And beginning this coming month, we will offer many opportunities for worship.

Throughout the world, as at Christ Church, Anglican services are noted for their rootedness in the Biblical, beautiful and reverent services in the Book of Common Prayer. Christ Church offers worship services which meet the needs of many people. At 9:00 and 11:00 (resuming Sept 10), we offer powerful, elegant services featuring excellent traditional music in our historic



downtown nave. At 11:05, we offer a beautiful, less-formal worship service featuring a contemporary music ensemble at Christ Church South on Jacksonville Highway. And at 7:30 in the morning, we offer a lovely, more contemplative traditional worship service in the nave, downtown.

Colossians 3.16 commends us to worship:

'Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts."

Mark your calendar. On Sunday September 10, we will celebrate an exciting new season at Christ Church. The Ministry Festival begins at 10. We will worship the Lord all morning long.

from the associate rector... The Rev. Cole Hartin, Associate Rector

One of the things I love about the Christian tradition is the church calendar. Every year we are brought to confront the same mysteries again and again: Advent and the incarnation, Epiphany and revelation, Easter and resurrection, Pentecost and the sending of the Spirit. The church calendar gives structure to our lives and to our faith and reminds that there is a seasonality to being a Christian. Indeed there is a seasonality to being a human – we see this as we journey through the seasons: Summer, comes before autumn, which comes before winter, which leads into spring.

The school year brings with it a kind of seasonality too. There is something amorphous about summer, with schedules that relax, as we enjoy time with family and friends. As we look to September, our calendar fills up and our free time tightens. We come to a natural juncture that reminds us that another year is passing by.

In each season or time in our lives—much like the times and season in the church year—our experience is different. The author of Ecclesiastes puts it this way, "For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted" (Eccles. 3:1-2). Part of what it means to live as Christians faithful to Jesus is to recognize the season in which we are living, the times we must be busy planting, getting ready for new birth, and the times we need to get ready for dying, for plucking up what is planted.

Not all parts of our lives are the same: There are seasons of grief and lament, often followed by seasons of healing and renewal. Seasons of rest and refreshment lead to seasons where we must tighten our belts and hunker down. For many of us, the fall is such a season.

And it's not just that our lives come in season, but twice our Scriptures remind us that our lives themselves only last a season. In both Isaiah 40, and 1 Peter 1 we are told that

All flesh is grass;

their constancy is like the flower of the field.

The grass withers; the flower fade.

but the word of our God will stand forever.

To put this another way: Life is short. Our days might seem long, but as we look back upon the years, they seem to have flown by. Everything is changing all of the time, and this means we learn to let go of what is lost as we embrace the next adventure God has for us. And most importantly, it means recognizing that God's word stands fast in the midst of all of the changes and chances of this fleeting world.

Whether September and back-to-school comes as a relief or a burden, my prayer is that we might recognize God's gracious hand in all of this, knowing that Jesus was here for a season, and embraced the seasonality of life. We can trust him as we pass through this season, this life, praying for grace as we live in the hope of the eternal life – that everlasting Sabbath that he has won for us.


In worship we do several things as a congregation. We kneel together, we stand together, we pray together AND we sing together. In the book of Psalm, it says to:

The Hallelujah Capital Campaign is going strong!

- This is a summer campaign to raise \$3 million or more to remodel the lower level of CCD Bell Building and to add a wing at **CCS**. Both are for Children's Ministry.
- The Halleluiah Campaign also includes **Endowment Funds** for repair and maintenance of facilities on both campuses to ensure Christ Church remains a foundation of faith both now and in the future.



Q & A Here are some questions some have had.

What is a pledge card and why use it? This is not a contract, but a statement of intent. With these cards, our parish administrator will know what funds to expect and when to expect them. Your commitment will guide us in our financial planning.

May I change my commitment if necessary? Yes. If you experience an unexpected change in your financial circumstances, you may increase or decrease your giving plan by contacting Diana Keesev.

When do I begin giving? The 3 year giving phase can depend on your circumstances. You determine your personal giving schedule: it may be weekly, monthly, or a variation acknowledged by the parish administrator.

When will we find out the total amount pledged in the Hallelujah Campaign? Pledge totals will be announced mid to late September.

When do we start/complete the projects? How aggressive we can be with our timeline depends on how quickly we can reach our goal. Assuming we raise what we need in pledges this summer, we can begin work this fall at CCS and begin the renovations at CCD immediately following completion of the south addition. We anticipate construction at CCS to take about six months.

What about my annual pledge? It is still needed! The Hallelujah Campaign is for building expansion and improvement and an endowment to ensure our facilities for the future. Christ Church still has ongoing parish operations. We keep the funds separated.

What is an average gift? What should a capital gift be? Stewardship is not about "equal gifts but about equal sacrifice". There is neither a formula for determining that pledge, nor is there a benchmark for the giving of an "average gift." Instead of measuring your gift by the dollar amount, you might ask yourself these questions:

- 1. Was this a prayerful decision seeking God's will?
- 2. Did I take a step of faith that deepens my own discipleship?
- 3. If everyone else in the church made a sacrifice equal to my own (in terms of commitment rather than dollars), would God be honored by that level of commitment/investment?

Things to remember:

- Goal of 3 million for Children's Ministry and Endowment
- Pledges can be spread over 3 years
- In order to reach our goal, help is needed from everyone! All gifts are vital to the success of this campaign. It is important for all to participate in the ownership of this project, share in the joy of seeing the finished product, and know that Christ Church will continue to raise Godly children and make disciples well into the future.



NEHEMIAH @ CCS & CCD

The theme of Nehemiah is the Lord's protection of his people and the need for their faithfulness in keeping the Torah (the Mosaic law) and their faithfulness in worship. After the exile, God is renewing his people in the land, in order to carry out what he promised to Abraham. God's people must renew their commitment to covenant faithfulness, laying hold of God's forgiveness and seeking to practice purity in their corporate and private lives. God in his mercy raised up Ezra the priest and teacher, and Nehemiah the governor, to lead his people in the hard work that this renewal requires. (ESV Study Bible Introduction to Nehemiah)

ANGLICANISM 102 @ CCS

Confirmation is a sacramental rite of the church in which the Bishop lays hands on a person who publicly affirms his or her faith in Christ. For many, confirmation is a reaffirmation of commitments made to Christ on their behalf at their baptism as children. For others, it is a means of joining the church. It is for all a celebrated and solemn sacrament which expresses our faith in Christ.
