

This coming Sunday is special because there is a Ministry Festival subtitled Serve Beyond Sunday. It is a Sunday that traditionally has been a Sunday for the church to "rally" as we "gear up" after summer vacations and "round up" participants in the many ministry opportunities at Christ Church. As I thought about the Serve Beyond Sunday Ministry Festival, I remembered our Epistle from last Sunday's service from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans, Chapter 12.

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ² Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

In this passage from Romans, St. Paul is encouraging us to serve beyond Sunday. If you are one of those people who come to church every Sunday and participate in worship at Christ Church and then go home, encouraged and refreshed, thanks be to God. God Bless you. Please continue. I think Paul is encouraging us to go deeper, though, and find other ways to participate and to serve whether on Sunday or other days of the week. This coming Sunday, September 10, the Ministry Festival will be at 10:00 AM on both Christ Church campuses. This will be a good place to for you to discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. There will be representatives of more that 25 Christ Church ministries there to discuss their ministries. Incidentally, there will also be coffee and breakfast goodies plus great Christian fellowship.

³ For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. ⁴ For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. ⁶ Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; ⁷ if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; ⁸ the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

Paul tells us to take an honest look at ourselves to see where we might participate or serve. We are all members of the Body of Christ, and all have gifts to enhance the Body in one way or another. Please come to the Ministry Festival on September 10, and, if you are not now Serving Beyond Sunday, please sign up for something.



The theme of Nehemiah is the Lord's protection of his people and the need for their faithfulness in keeping the Torah (the Mosaic law) and their faithfulness in worship. After the exile, God is renewing his people in the land, in order to carry out what he promised to Abraham. God's people must renew their commitment to covenant faithfulness, laying hold of God's forgiveness and seeking to practice purity in their corporate and private lives. God in his mercy raised up Ezra the priest and teacher, and Nehemiah the governor, to lead his people in the hard work that this renewal requires. (ESV Study Bible Introduction to Nehemiah)

Join Deacon Stine in a discussion of the Sunday Eucharistic Lessons.


*Lectionary is an ordered system for reading the Holy Scriptures.

 $\underline{\text{Anglicanism 102}}$ Confirmation is a sacramental rite of the church in which the Bishop lays hands on a person who publicly affirms his or her faith in Christ. For many, confirmation is a reaffirmation of

commitments made to Christ on their behalf at their baptism as children. For others, it is a means of joining the church. It is for all a celebrated and solemn sacrament which expresses our faith in Christ.


