I look forward to worshipping, and celebrating, with you in the coming weeks.



**Providence** is a term that has fallen out of use in our lives as Christians. True, there are still scholarly books about the doctrine that come out every few years, but most Christians, most of the time, are not thinking about providence.

A google search of the term's usage in English shows this to be true. It's use has declined significantly over the past couple hundred years.



# What is providence, anyways?

Providence is the word Christians use to reference God's protecting and sustaining care of his creation. Providence is what we mean when we talk about God preserving and guiding the world.

Another definition, one from the sixteenth-century Reformed theologian Peter Martyr Vermigli, has it that providence is the '*meane which God useth in directing of things to their proper ends*.' What Vermigli means here is that God creates all things (including you!) with a purpose, and he is actively involved in seeing that all creation (including you!) reaches that purpose for which he created it.

Providence was a popular point of conversation for Christians in Early Modern England, especially as they sought to make sense of the beautiful and bewildering world around them. How was God present to them in their daily lives? Where was God when they were sick? What did it mean when that earthquake happened, or this war broke out?

The world has only become more complex since the sixteenth century, and it would do us good to think a little more deeply about the doctrine as we ask similar questions.

In a world over which we have so much control, where inexhaustible knowledge is available with the swipe of our phone, we might fail to see that God is providentially ordering our lives. Birth and death belong to God, and however much we might plan and mitigate risk of what lays between them, so much of our lives is outside of our hands.

The doctrine of providence helps us see that this lack of control is not a failure on our part, nor is it a cause for despair given the seeming randomness of life. No, the doctrine of the providence reminds us that God is intimately involved in all of our life, sustaining us, guiding us, weaving our decisions and actions into his plan for all people.

Just as God was at work in making all things by his Word, so now he is at work, crafting our lives, directing them toward him. We can't always see God at work, but you can rest assured that he is there and his good plans will not be undone.

While on vacation with my daughter last week she surmised that you can tell a lot about the values of a place

by looking at its skyline. Or can you? We spent last week in the "Holy City", Charleston, SC. Looking out the window of our hotel we could count six steeples, most taller than the tallest buildings. According to the Park Ranger Guide on our Ft. Sumter tour, long ago the city passed an ordinance that no downtown building could be taller than the tallest of those steeples, that of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church's 297-footer. On first impression, it would seem that Charleston is inhabited by thousands of God-Fearing souls. Is it really? Maybe. But a Saturday night stroll down King St. with its myriad bars, clubs and pubs might make you rethink judging that book (or in this case, city) by its cover. According to psychologicalscience.org, "First impressions have been shown to last for months (Gunaydin, Selcuk, & Zayas, 2017) and affect personal judgments even in the presence of contradictory evidence about the individual (e.q., Rydell & McConnell, 2006). People tend to form split-second impressions with regard to others' presumably stable characteristics, such as trustworthiness and competence." (emphasis mine) With this in mind, what kind of impression (first, fiftieth or otherwise) will you make today? remember to greet each day with hope and "put away all bitterness and wrath and anger" and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, Forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven us. 


# Reaffirmation
