#### From the Rector:

A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols was originally created in 1880 by Bishop E.W. Benson of Truro in England. Developed and curated over the following decades, a new version debuted at King's College, Cambridge on Christmas Eve, 1918.

That service in 1918 made a mark! The nave of the chapel at Kings College was filled to the brim. The hearts of those participants, fresh from the horrors of the Great War, overflowed with emotion and thanksgiving. In 1928, the BBC broadcast the service. In 1932, the BBC's newly created 'Empire Service' enabled the Service of Lessons and Carols to be broadcast throughout the British Empire, and a few years later, throughout the world. Almost a hundred years since the first broadcast, billions of people have celebrated the anniversary of the birth of Christ Jesus to the hymns, carols, and Scripture readings of that marvelous service.

I first experienced Lessons and Carols as a boy in Corpus Christi. I was drawn in from the moment the choir sang the first line of 'Once in Royal David's City.' Over four decades later, this very special service highlights the season of Advent. It helps to prepare me and many millions of others, once again, to celebrate the birth of Christ.



## from the associate rector... **The Rev. Dr. Cole Hartin,**Associate Rector

This past September, just a couple of months ago, a group of us from Christ Church had the privilege to go to a conference at Church of the Incarnation in Dallas called Radvo. The name "Radvo" is short for "Radical Vocation", and the conference was aimed for those who are discerning or serving in ministry in the Anglican Communion. The *vocation* to be a priest or a deacon is a *radical* one, especially in the challenging and changing religious landscape of 21st century America.

While the whole conference was edifying and encouraging, one of the keynote talks by a Church of England priest and professor at Duke, Jeremy Begbie, was especially good. Begbie gave a lecture on the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church. I think it is safe to say that it was one of the favourites of our group from Christ Church.

Tying in his theological reflection with music and images, one of the points that Begbie made was the Holy Spirit "unfurls" our hearts as Christians. Left to our own we tend to close ourselves off from God and from others. Thankfully, the graciousness of God opens us up. This image of our hearts unfurling has stuck with me over these past several weeks.



Joyful, joyful, we adore thee, God of glory, Lord of love; hearts unfold like flowers before thee, opening to the sun above. (Italics mine.)

It reminds me too of the prayer of St. Paul in Ephesians, where he writes, I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may perceive what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints. (Ephesians 1:16-18, NRSV, italics mine).

St. Paul's prayer is that our hearts might be "enlightened" or "opened" as a corollary to the Father's gift of wisdom and revelation. Both "Joyful, Joyful" and the language of Scripture give us the impression that before God, we are laid bare, opened.

Now, there are many reasons for us to close our hearts, to turn inward into ourselves, to furl up in self-protection. Friends betray us, family lets us down, and we are buffeted by the temptations and tricks of the world.

But by the grace of God, there can be just this unfurling, unfolding, enlightening of our hearts when we venture out in trust.

I want to live this way.

Though I feel like I have a long way to go, and there are often reasons for cynicism and despair, I can say that God has been doing this kind of "opening" work in my heart. I am grateful for the cracks of light pouring in.

As we head to the end of Ordinary Time, and look forward to Advent, I pray that the Father might continue to "unfurl" my heart and yours. Though the days are shorter, there is no reason we cannot experience the ever brightening love of God.






