The first to hear this world-changing news was not the Emperor or the High Priest. It was a group of sleepy shepherds working the nigh shift in a field outside a very small town in flyover country.

The Message of the angel has transformed the world. This year, hear it anew. And invite the Lord to fill your heart with great joy and deep faith. Christ the Lord has come!

I used to hate packing.

It filled me with dread and anxiety. I'd ask myself: "Will I really need a sweater on this trip?"

Over the past few years, I've had to travel often for little diocesan trainings and continuing education events. This has meant I have had many opportunities to practice packing. So much so, that I'm starting to get better at it. In fact, I've come to really love packing, especially if I'm not in a rush.

I've gotten pretty good at whittling down what I need to fit in one backpack. There is something pleasing, too, in organizing the clothes, toiletries, and (my favourite) in selecting which books I will read on a trip.

And all the while there is this lovely anticipation, a sense of excitement for a long road trip or a short flight.

The mood of Advent is a lot like this. We have a season to get ready, to get organized, all for a big event. We are not going on a trip, but we are looking forward to something special. The most immediate thing on our minds, of course, is Christmas, along with all of the practicalities that come with it. We are busy planning who will be bringing what dish to supper, which books or games or pajamas to buy our kids, and which Christmas Eve service we'll attend.

Sentimentality is part of it. We remember Christmases from our childhood, or time spent with family who are no longer with us.

But there is something more than sentimentality at play. While Advent is the time to prepare for Christ's coming to us two thousand years ago, it also prepares us for far more than a memorial of something good that happened a long time ago.

Advent prepares us for our future with God. As we journey through this season, we are reminded not only that Christ came, but that he is coming again for us. There are ways we must prepare for this, to ensure that our lives and our values line up, because Jesus is coming again to judge the living and the dead.

There is something that is pleasing about this preparation in the same way it can be pleasing to pack for a trip. We can take stock of where we are and what we have, and we can look ahead to what we'll need to hang on to when Christ comes again. A lot of the items that demand so much of our focus now start to fall away when we see what really matters. Advent is a time to get ready, to refocus. When we are ready for Christmas, we can really enjoy it. When we are ready for Christ's coming again, we can embrace it with joy.


Hello Wonderful Families,




