One of the great gifts of the catholic tradition to which we are heirs in The Episcopal Church is the Church calendar or Christian year. This is the name we give to the ordering of time around the narrative of salvation, the good news we celebrate in Jesus. It's not that the natural seasons or cultural festivities are not worth remembering, but we always experience these in the light of the story of God's creating the world, coming to us in Jesus, sending the Holy Spirit to us, and drawing us back to God.

The days on the Christian calendar can be roughly divided into two categories: Festal time and ferial time.

We've just finished one the great festal seasons of the Church. I'm talking about Christmas, and the twelve days set aside for celebratory worship, feasting, and thanksgiving. Epiphany too is a feast, but the time following Epiphany is filled with ferial days.

Ferial days are days where there is nothing much special going on in the Church calendar. They are just ordinary, run-of-the-mill, business-as-usual.

In his book *The Supper of the Lamb*, Robert Farrar Capon talks about the way festal and ferial days shape the way we eat. We feast on festal days and eat sensibly on ferial days. If at Christmas we devour a whole turkey or a sup on a sumptuous prime rib, ferial days are filled with tuna casserole and hamburger soup.

Both festal and ferial days are good in their own way, and the wisdom of the Christian year is to point to the fittingness of each.

As much as I love a good feast with rich food and syrupy desserts, it doesn't take long for my heartburn and waistline to remind me that these meals are special, festal, for a reason. It is good to eat and drink and be merry with family and friends as we celebrate Christmas and Easter and Pentecost. But it is also good to cut back, to sup on bread and soup, to trade wine for water, especially in the many ferial days of the year.

Now ferial days are not fasts. They are not the days to deprive ourselves. But they are just normal days, days or just enough, not more than we need.

January brings us back to ferial time.

There are many reasons these unremarkable days are still good ones. Just one reason is that they are a reminder of the presence of God in the slow growth that take place when nothing flashy is going on. These aren't days to throw away. On the contrary, just as our closest relationships develop and grow in the rhythms of everyday life, so does our faith. Sure, we might remember the high-lights, the festivals, because they are special, but that doesn't mean the ferial days are not important.

God does a lot of good work when nobody is watching.




