Zephaniah 3.14-17


'Mardi Gras' is French for 'Fat Tuesday'.



Being loved by God, and loving God, is the meaning of life. Jesus points us to the Father, and the Father sends the Spirit to live in our hearts as Christians, empowering us to walk in love and service to the Lord and others. If we miss this, we miss everything.

And in the same breath, contemplating God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—is the richest and most satisfying way to use our intellects. This contemplation manifests itself in beauty.

One of the wonderful but secondary benefits of being loved by and loving God is the production of beautiful culture in the world. If you look at the marks of Christian civilization your see inspiring architecture, hear glorious music, experience breathtaking art, and—most dear to my heart—read wonderful literature. This all flows out of the Christian response to God's love and truth. As the psalmist puts it:

For you have made me glad by your acts, O Lord, and I shout for joy because of the works of your hands.

Lord, how great are your works! your thoughts are very deep. (Psalm 92:4-5)

This is not to say that Christian civilization is perfect or that Christians are without sin. Rather, all of this beauty shines forth despite the Church's sin and failing.

In the Anglican tradition especially, we are heir to some of the most wonderful literature, the most beautiful of words, in the English language. We can see this even in our prayerbook, that is infused with beautiful theology (drawn from Scripture, St. Augustine, and John Calvin) but also in its elegant and elevating language.

On the cold days of January and February, we have some opportunity to stay indoors and rediscover the rich heritage of our Church: We can read the mystical writings of Julian of Norwich, the magisterial theology of Richard Hooker, the soul-searching poetry of George Herbert, or the sweet poetry of Christina Rossetti. Even closer to our own time we have so much beauty offered up: In the tales C.S. Lewis, of course, but also the stories of Madeleine L'Engle, and in the Anglican influences in the tragic work of Chinua Achebe.

This is to say nothing of the many wonderful writers who share a common faith with us, even if it is in the broader Catholic Church, outside of our Episcopal fold: Marilynne Robinson, Christian Wiman, David Bentley Hart, and Kate Bowler.

It is also to say nothing about the wonderful art produced by folks who are not Christians, but that might open our hearts to God's beauty and truth.

There are so many good books, and since the weather is cold, it's a great time to read them, prayerfully, joyfully, and in thanksgiving for God's goodness.
