FROM THE RECTOR:

O Lord, who for our sake didst fast forty days, and forty nights: give us grace to use such Abstinence that Our flesh being subdued to the spirit, we may ever Obey thy godly motions in righteousness, and true holiness, to thy honour and glory. Collect for the first Sunday in Lent

Beginning Ash Wednesday, February 14, Christ Church will join over a billion Christians around the world in the observance of Lent.

Anglican bishop and theologian N.T. Wright notes, "Lent is a time for discipline, for confession, for honesty, not because God is mean or fault-finding or finger-pointing but because He wants us to know the joy of being cleaned out, ready for all the good things He now has in store."

Over the centuries, many millions of believers have found it useful to fast and/or to embrace a meaningful spiritual discipline during Lent. This year, Christ Church is offering a series of resources to assist our spiritual growth as we walk through Lent with the Lord. Beginning Tuesday February 20, we will offer a five-part Lenten Lecture & Lunch series reflecting on Saints of the British Isles. From Columba to Julian of Norwich, these especially faithful men and women offer lessons which continue to edify and strengthen our faith. We will gather in our historic downtown nave at noon for worship and a reflection followed by a delightful lunch in the parish hall.

And on March 1, we are thrilled to welcome the Rev. Dr. Russell Levenson to Tyler for a series of Lenten talks on life with Jesus. An exceptional preacher and teacher, Rev. Levenson is the rector of St. Martin's Episcopal Church in Houston, and will speak at two forums: a luncheon at noon at Willow Brook Country Club on Friday, March 1 and a prayer breakfast in the downtown parish hall on Saturday, March 2 at 9:00. Why do we bother fasting during Lent?

What's the point in giving up meals, or coffee, or chocolate or booze? There is nothing wrong with these things in and of themselves. In Christian moderation, they are good things.

And, more to the point: As Christians, we believe in *grace*. God loves us and sent Jesus to us not because we deserved it or because we worked hard for it, but rather as a free gift. We're forgiven and set free with no strings attached, so why would we bother doing something as unpleasant as fasting?

The great German Lutheran theologian and martyr, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, might be able to help us out here. Bonhoeffer struggled to comes to grip with what it meant to be a Christian in a Germany governed by the Third Reich. So many of his countrymen were enthralled by the Fürher and saw no contradiction between their staid Christian faith and the mass extermination of six million souls. The barbarous acts of hatred performed against Jews, the disabled, and other minorities went on without many Christians batting an eye.

How could this happen?

In his popular book, *The Cost of Discipleship*, Bonhoeffer wagers that perhaps his fellow Germans, fellow Christians, had gotten mixed up about what grace really means. He makes the distinction between *cheap* grace and *costly* grace, writing:

Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession, absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.

Yes, there is a kind of grace at work in the lives of these Christians, but they've cheapened it by separating it from the rigors of the life of discipleship. This is not how grace is meant to be received.

Rather, Bonhoeffer notes, we ought to see grace as costly. We should be willing to do anything because of it.

Costly grace is the treasure hidden in the field; for the sake of it a man will go and sell all that he has. It is the pearl of great price to buy which the merchant will sell all his goods. It is the kingly rule of Christ, for whose sake a man will pluck out the eye which causes him to stumble; it is the call of Jesus Christ at which the disciple leaves his nets and follows him.

Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again, the gift which must be asked for, the door at which a man must knock.

Costly grace, in other words, requires something of us. I think we really know this deep down, but Lent is a time where we get to clarify our vision a little bit, to remember what grace is all about. To fast, to pray, to be penitent, is not a way of trying to wrest grace from God's hands, but it's more about making sure that there is nothing blocking us from receiving it rightly. It's about clearing a path, making ready, so that the grace we've been given has not been given in vain.

As we look ahead to the coming weeks, then, let us be open to costly grace. Let us keep a holy Lent.

Last year we looked at Lent using metaphors for things we were familiar with such as flying a kite and metamorphosis. It was a fun way to develop a deeper understanding of this season where we are moving from the celebration of Epiphany and into more contemplative worship. As I contemplate and pray about my personal devotions for Lent this year, I am also praying for the upcoming First Communion Class.

If you grew up in the Episcopal church and are of a "certain age", you probably didn't receive Communion until your Confirmation. The Bishop confirmed you in your new white dress or snazzy suit, and then you received. I can still picture my dress with eyelet lace around the hem and sleeves. I loved that thing! 


