FROM THE RECTOR:

Lent is a forty-day spiritual journey. From it's beginning on Ash Wednesday, in this season we hear especially of God's call for us to 'deny ourselves, take up the Cross' and follow Jesus.

The destination of Lent is the Cross of Christ. And the days in which we make that final journey to Calvary is Holy Week.

Beginning on Palm Sunday, March 24, we will join many millions of Christians throughout the world by looking back to that fateful week in which Jesus entered Jerusalem in triumph, prepared the disciples for what was coming, washed their feet, instituted the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist, died on the Cross at Golgotha, and was buried in the tomb of a friend.

From Palm Sunday to Holy Saturday, every day we will walk another step in the journey to the Cross, gathering daily to worship the Lord.

In *The Four Loves*, C.S. Lewis wrote this about Good Friday, "God, who needs nothing, loves into existence wholly superfluous creatures in order that he may love and perfect them. He creates the universe, already foreseeing the buzzing cloud of flies about the cross, the flayed back pressed against the uneven stake, the nails driven through the mesial nerves, the repeated incipient suffocation as the body droops, the repeated torture of back and arms...Herein is love. This is the diagram of Love Himself, the inventor of all loves."

I invite you to persevere in the observance of a Holy Lent. And prepare anew for the walk with Christ and Christ Church through Holy Week.


"Let anyone with ears, listen!" (Matthew 11:15 NRSV)

I've been thinking a lot about listening during this season of Lent. I even mentioned this in my last *Crucifer* article about poetry.

That's because one of the challenges of my life, and an area of growth for me, is learning to become a better listener.

First and foremost I want to listen well to God. This means that I want to have the time and leisure in prayer to attend to what God is saying or not saying. It also means I want to have the quietness of heart to really read and understand Holy Scripture. Life has a way of becoming so busy that this kind of listening gets crowded out.

I also want to be a good listener to others. I want to be a husband who really listens to my wife who I love. I want to be a father who listens well to his sons (and this kind of listening is perhaps the most challenging at this stage of life!). I want to be the kind of friend who listens well to those close to me. And I want to be the kind of priest and pastor who makes the people who talk to me feel deeply listened to.



Murphy begins her book by asking,

When was the last time you listened to someone? *Really* listened, without thinking about what you wanted to say next, glancing down at your phone, or jumping in to offer your opinion? And when was the last time someone *really* listened to you? Was so attentive to what you were saying and whose response was so spot-on that you felt truly understood?

She goes on to say that "In modern life, we are encouraged to listen to our hearts, listen to our inner voices, and listen to our guts, but rarely are we encouraged to listen carefully and with intent to other people."

Murphy is right. And I'd like to see this change, even if in some small way.

I have had the privilege to be *really* listened to by a handful of people over the course of my life. These wonderful listeners include Amy, my wife; a kind priest and mentor Fr. Ajit; and a wise Christian counsellor who listened to me as I went through a time of great pain. In all of these cases being listened to left me feeling lightened, encouraged, and deeply known. Being listened to helped me to walk with Jesus, to know that God was listening to me too.

I want to be a kind of person who helps others to feel that way. And I hope that as Christians as we listen to Jesus, that we can be the kind of listeners that the world really needs, and by our listening, we might lead them to know God.
