#### FROM THE RECTOR:

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. Psalm 23.1-3a

God consecrated the Sabbath, and commanded us to observe it, because people need rest.

Yes, we need sleep. Every day. But sabbath is a day each week in which we are commended and called to cease our work and embrace a day of rest and worship.

Sabbath is different for priests. Clergy invest their professional lives ministering, discipling and shepherding people. They work to create and lead worship services on the sabbath which will equip, renew, exhort, and

spiritually refresh a community of believers.


But Sundays are not sabbath for clergy.

Mindful of this, the diocese of Texas requires congregations to provide a month of vacation and two weeks of continuing education for their priests every year. And to provide a sabbatical to full-time priests every seven years. These best practices are observed throughout the diocese and most of the Episcopal Church.

For priests, sabbatical is a prolonged time of rest and refreshment from congregational life and work. It's intent is the refreshment and renewal of the clergy. Bishop Fisher, for example, was on sabbatical in the summer of 2023, Fr. Matt took sabbatical in 2018, and I was grateful for sabbatical in 2017.

This summer of 2024 is my sabbatical summer.

Following Bishop Doyle's episcopal visit to Tyler on Sunday, June 2, the Luckenbach's will board an airplane



and leave town for several months. I look forward to a prolonged time of rest, and intend to invest substantial time beside the still waters with the Lord. I will return to Tyler in September, refreshed and better equipped to lead our congregation in the months and years ahead.

Christ Church continues to be well-served by an exceptional team, and we will surely be in good hands this summer through the ministry of Fr Cole, Fr. Ted, and Deacon Stine.

June is still some weeks away, and we look forward to worship, faith formation, the grand opening of the Children's Ministry Center at Christ Church South, and a myriad of excellent worship services and joy-filled gatherings which await us over the coming days.

May the Lord lead you beside the still waters and restore your soul.

## from the associate rector... The Rev. Dr. Cole Hartin, Associate Rector



I am writing this shortly before the eclipse reaches totality. In a few minutes, I, too, will be outside with the millions of others who will marvel at the darkness, the spectacle of the moon covering over the sun, turning day to night, at least for a few minutes.

And you, you will have probably forgotten about the event by the time you are reading this. It will be days old, stale news.

Life will go on as usual, save for that pair of carboard glasses sitting on your shelf. The news coverage will turn back to the unrest in the Middle East, in the Ukraine, and pundits will be speculating about the upcoming election, feeling the winds of political change.

But think about the eclipse again for a moment: Everyone was excited about it. People's response to the moon covering over the sun is interesting. The eclipse elicited everything from shrugged shoulders and a "so what?", to scientific curiosity; from joyful ecstasy, to dark end-time prophecies.

Christians have thought a lot about eclipses and other strange natural events for a long time. Peter N. Jordan, in his book Naturalism in the Christian Imagination: Providence and Causality in Early Modern England writes of the way Christian thinkers tried to make sense of astronomical events, earthquakes, and other unusual phenomena three and four hundred years ago.

While some folks, like the English priest John Spencer, thought that trying to interpret these unusual occurrences as a sign from God was "an odious stumbling block to genuine Christian religion", many others saw each earthquake and eclipse, flood and hurricane, to have a divine message. Still others saw that God was at work in these events, even if their meaning was obscure to them.


Four hundred years on and we are still fascinated by natural phenomena. We can better predict and explain the science behind many events, but their draw on our hearts and minds remains the same. We've lost the taste for the crude interpretation of natural disasters that we see from televangelists like Pat Robertson, but perhaps all of us feel that somehow, these events must mean something.

I think it's safe to say that the eclipse is a reminder that the world in which we live is not in our control. The best we can do is to move with the normal rhythms of the cosmos, marvel at the rare moments when the day is dark instead of light, and trust that the world will keep on spinning.

The world, after all, is God's: "How great are your works, LORD, how profound your thoughts!" (Psalm 92:5). And we too are God's, "the people of his pasture, the sheep of his hand."

What does the eclipse mean? I don't know. Perhaps nothing. Perhaps it conveys some message from God that we cannot fully grasp. But the sun and the moon are both part of God's creation, wonders that he fashioned, realities spoken into existence—like all of creation—by his Word, Jesus Christ.


