Ten months ago, we began an effort to raise over \$3 million to create and re-develop excellent spaces for children's ministry at Christ Church. I am thrilled to announce that we have completed the latest phase of this historic effort on time and under budget!

This Saturday April 27<sup>th</sup> at 4:00, we will cut the ribbon and welcome all to an open house at the new Children's Ministry Center at Christ Church South. With the essential help of Gary Avery, Bryan Rossman, and our building committee, we have created wonderful spaces in which children will grow as followers of Jesus for decades to come! And we have created a new Youth Center and Adult Gathering room as well!

Concurrently, our work re-developing the Bell building is well underway. God willing, in five months we will open our new Children's Ministry Center at our historic downtown campus. It promises to be a spectacular space for sharing the Gospel and equipping our children to know Christ.

By God's grace, this is an exciting season in the life of Christ Church. Please join us this Saturday at the open house, and thank you for your prayers and support of this great effort!

### Yet for all their joy they were still disbelieving and wondering. Luke 24:41

One of the truths I've been able to see, by the grace of God, this Eastertide, is that I am not responsible for keeping everything together. And by this, I mean to say, that I can't make ministry, or my family, or my life, work out the way I think it should work out. And this is just another way of saying, that, despite (or because of) my inability to direct the present and the future in the way that I think it should go, Jesus shows up in the midst of my life to remind me that he is God.

When Jesus appears to his disciples in Luke's Gospel, even after they've heard that Jesus had been raised, and even after (some of them) had seen the empty tomb, even after he is right in front of their faces, they still can't quite believe. Their joy is mingled with "disbelieving and wonder."

"How could this be?" they think to themselves. All the while Jesus is there ready to eat breakfast with them.


This was not at all on their agendas, having Jesus appear to them. It was never part of their plan, whatever plan they had. And whatever plan they had, whatever they intended to do, was swept out of their control. They all fled, and left Jesus on the cross. But he rose again.

And he showed up to them despite their disbelieving and then promised to send them the Holy Spirit so they could carry on his work. The mission of the Gospel will depend on them, it seems.

But at the same time, and in the same breath, nothing really depends on them, because Jesus has risen from the dead, and his rising happens whether the disciples believe or disbelief, whether they witness the empty tomb or they are cowering in a locked room. Everything depends on the power of God. So maybe the truth I've been learning at Easter is a paradox: I don't have to keep everything together, to keep life, or ministry, or family moving in the direction I want it to, because Jesus has been raised and will show up in my life (and yours) when he wants. We can't stop him. And we can't make him appear.

And this is freeing because it gives us permission to take a rest, to enjoy the Sabbath, where even God ceases from his work. It gives us permission to take a break, to have a meal with Jesus, because it seems, that despite all of the important things he will do and is doing, he still has time to eat some fish with his friends.

After the disciples take a rest with Jesus, and eat a meal with him, he teaches them and sends them out as witnesses. It all depends on them. And yet everything depends on him. Both are true, in some way. Everything begins and ends with Jesus, and us working with him (by the power of the Spirit) after we've had breakfast.


