FROM THE RECTOR:



As I am writing this, I am looking forward to a week of vacation to visit with Amy's parents. They are driving southwest, and we are driving northeast, and we'll meet in the middle near the Great Smoky Mountains in Tennessee. So I am trying to tie up loose ends and finish what I can before we leave. There is a lot to do. I probably can't complete everything on my "to-do" list. How can I make everything fit in the short time I have?

One solution would be for me to outsource some work to Artificial Intelligence (AI). It would be easy for me to use ChatGPT or some other AI program to write this post to save time, for instance. Likely, nobody would ever know.

Most of us by now have heard of AI, the ability of computer programs to produce what appear to be human thoughts, stories, and arguments. The programs are still clumsy and sketchy, but we are told in time these details will be smoothed out.

There are all kinds of questions we might ask about AI. In the Church, one question is whether or not it's appropriate for pastors and priests to use in their preaching and teaching. For me, the answer is a resounding "no."


Recently in a sermon I mentioned that I have not and will not use AI in writing my homilies at Christ Church. It's not because I am anti-technology or anything like that. I am writing this on my laptop and carry around a smart phone that I use to listen to music and audiobooks.


Still, I feel that the relationship between a reader and writer, and especially between a pastor and his or her listeners is one of trust. Each week I have the burden and privilege(!) to study Holy Scripture, to pray, to draw from literature and experience to share a message about Jesus that, by the grace of God, might be used by the Holy Spirit to open our hearts to live more fully in the love of God. And you all have the burden(!) and privilege to have to listen to me.

I know you are busy, that there is a lot you could be doing with your time, and that you've made an effort to honor God by coming to worship him, to receive the sacrament, but also to hear the Bible, God's Word, preached. So the last thing I want to do is to pass the buck to a computer to write a script for me to read.

I am not making a blanket judgement on anyone for using AI as the basis of a project, especially where then they take and craft what it gives them and turn it into something personal and human. Occasionally, I use AI-generated images on my slides to illustrate sermons at Christ Church South.

But I have decided that I will not use it in my writing, and that you don't have to worry about me using it. If anything changes, I will let you know. Even though I have these powerful tools at my fingertips, I plan to write and teach and preach the old fashioned way. To borrow a phrase from Leif Enger (in fact a title of one of his books), I see what AI offers me, and "I cheerfully refuse."






