

#### FROM THE RECTOR:

Over seven hundred years before the Incarnation of Christ, the prophet Isaiah spoke the word of God to the Israelites. This was a season of profound change for God's people—from a season of affluence and peace under King Uzziah to the experience of defeat and humiliation at the hands of the Assyrians.

Isaiah is the first of the Major Prophets in the Bible. For over 2,000 years, God has used Isaiah to encourage, exhort, rebuke, correct, and inspire the people of God.

God also called Isaiah to an essential role—preparing the world for the coming of Christ.

God gave the prophet a vision of the Messiah—the 'Anointed One'. Isaiah paints three powerful portraits of the Christ—the King (1-37), the Servant (38-55), and the Anointed Ruler (56-66).

Some of the most powerful passages in all the Scriptures are found in Isaiah. In Isaiah 9, for instance, the prophet shares,

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined.

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and for evermore.

The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

# from the associate rector... The Rev. Dr. Cole Hartin, Associate Rector

This summer, while visiting our family in Canada, we spent a lot of time walking along the beaches of the Bay of Fundy. The Bay of Fundy experiences some of the highest tides in the world, with fluctuation of over 50 feet between low tide and high tide occurring twice daily. In some places, when the tide is low, you can walk out over half a mile onto the ocean floor. Six hours later, there might be only a slim 6 or 7 feet of sand until the tide starts to drag out again.

At Bayshore Beach in Saint John, a short walk from where we were staying, we tried to head out at both high tide and low tide to walk along the shore. This kind of walk was not always easy, because, though there are patches of fine sand, there are also places where you have to walk over small rocks and boulders. It makes for a painful walk going barefoot and is difficult even with shoes on. If you're not careful, you can sprain your ankle.

If you try to skirt the worst of the rocks by walking in the water, your legs start to go numb. I am not sure exactly how cold the water was this past month, but I read online it usually warms to a balmy 46F, even in the height of summer.

I found the most pleasant walking was just a few feet out from the edge of the water. This sand tended to be the most stable and solid. If you're careful of the waves, you can keep your shoes on without getting soaked. Walking too much away from the edge of the water and the sand and rocks are treacherous, and walking too close to the water means icy wet feet. Staying near the edge there is a way, one that is always shifting with the tide, but stable and easygoing, nonetheless.

As I was walking along this slim path, I couldn't help thinking about the Christian life. My experience of the life of faith has taught me that very often the way forward following Jesus requires just this kind of balance, staying right near the edge of faith, without straying toward gullibility on the one side or skepticism on the other.

What do I mean by this? I think what I am trying to say is that so much of faith is staying near the edge of uncertainty and discomfort. I am tempted to have an overly saccharine view of faith, in which I assume everything will work out fine. But this kind of naïve faith leads to disillusionment when reality catches up. Life is not always so straightforward as I'd like it to be. Experience is like that cold ocean water when it catches you off guard.

But the temptation in the opposite direction is not to bother with faith at all, because any time we trust God to provide for us, to lead us, we are vulnerable. All trust involves some kind of vulnerability. And so we keep Jesus at arm's length, a little like walking far away from the water's edge. You can do it for a while, but life is unnecessarily onerous and difficult.

Instead, Jesus invites us to walk in the way of the cross, in the way of vulnerability. This means trusting God will provide, staying close to the edge, but also having a sober mind about where the cross leads. Death. But also resurrection. Not always easy, but a way forward, the best way forward. The way of the cross becomes the way of life.






### BRICK STREET BLOCK PARTY is Sunday, October 19 from 5-7pm




