#### FROM THE RECTOR:


May God grant to the living, grace;

-Traditional Anglican Blessing

This prayer is engraved on the outside wall of Canterbury Cathedral and Westminster Abbey in England.

A blessing offered in Anglican worship since at least the reign of Elizabeth I, this rich prayer recalls to me the Feast of All Saints.

Our culture remembers All Hallows Eve by dressing in costume and trick or treating. But for many centuries, the Church has gathered together on All Saints weekend to remember the faithful departed.

The venerable Anglican blessing captures the heart of our hopes on All Saints – that God would bless us all – the living and the dead. And that by remembering the faithful departed, we are inspired by their witness to be ever more faithful ambassadors of the Lord.



We will observe the Feast of All Saints on Sunday, November 2. We will recall the lives and ministry of the faithful departed. We will gather Saturday night to celebrate life in Christ at the **Fall Festival**, replete with the Chili Cook-Off, Trunk-or-Treat, and a petting zoo! And Sunday evening, we will worship in our downtown nave with a magnificent **Choral Evensong**.

As the weather begins to turn, the leaves start to fall away, and the sunshine grows dimmer, may God grant you grace, peace, and eternal life.

# from the associate rector... **The Rev. Dr. Cole Hartin**Associate Rector

I'm reading through a book of letters of spiritual direction that the great scholar and author C. S. Lewis wrote throughout his lifetime. (Thank you to Clyde and Laurel for lending it to me! I'm almost finished with it!).

The book is called *Yours, Jack: Spiritual Direction from C. S. Lewis* and chronicles Lewis's own spiritual development from atheist to Christian, but also this gives one a peak into some of the wisdom he shared with those who wrote to him over the years.

In one of the letters written to Sarah Neylan, one of Lewis's godchildren, he writes this:

Remember that there are only three kinds of things anyone need ever do.

- (1) Things we ought to do
- (2) Things we've got to do
- (3) Things we like doing.

I say this because some people seem to spend so much of their time doing things for none of the three reasons, things like reading books they don't like because other people read them. Things you ought to do are things like doing one's school work or being nice to people. Things one has got to do are things like dressing and undressing, or household shopping. Things one likes doing — but of course I don't know what you like. Perhaps you'll write and tell me one day. (pp.133-34).

This little piece of wisdom struck me. First, because it was memorable – one must only do things one's got to do, ought to do, or likes to do. But also, because I think Lewis hits on something that I think is one of the most

pressing pastoral challenges for families in the church today, and certainly is a pressing challenge for me. The challenge is this: There is simply *too much to do*!

I've talked to so many families, here in Tyler, and back in Canada about just a barrage of expectations of things that need to get done. Aside from obligations for work and school, it seems like there is an ever growing list of extra-curricular activities, housework, social events, sports, and social media that keeps families running on the hamster wheel of life.

That's where Lewis is helpful. We only have to worry about what we've got to do, ought to do, and like to do.

We all ought to be conscientious at work and school. We've all got to take care of the practical needs as individuals and families. Then of course, we can do whatever we like to do.

But that's it. We can say no—indeed, ought to say no—to other events and activities that tire us out.

As Christians we don't need to worry about "keeping up with the Joneses." We must take care of our responsibilities like everyone else, but we can say "no thanks" to the extras to make time for what we really like to do, things we enjoy doing. We can—in other words—keep room in our lives for *leisure*.

Leisure is where joy hides out, where prayer flowers, and creativity comes back to us. Sometimes life is busy and we can't help it. But sometimes we can! And when we can, we should. Being busy is not necessarily a virtue.
